The incumbent will work on a variety of regional projects in team settings and as appropriate, assume coordination duties for selected projects as well as work with others inside and outside of the Institute to achieve project-related goals.

Position Requirements

Bachelor's Degree in related field required (minimum); Master's degree preferred. Fields include (but aren't limited to) economics, business, planning, statistics, urban/rural studies, sociology, and political science. Experience with statistical software packages such as STATA, R or other similar software necessary.

Knowledge of data sources, including those for economic, labor, and population data required. Experience in performing regional economic analysis required. Demonstrated ability to use statistical software for data manipulation, analysis and visualization required. Demonstrated ability to create data-based content, including written content and visualizations necessary. Must be able to work effectively independently and as part of a team.
